SPRING is committed to raising the bar for IYCF and other nutrition SBCC materials, and to sharing resources between and across programs.





To date, we have collaborated with UNICEF on several C-IYCF adaptations, including finalizing the full generic package in Nigeria, and developing C-IYCF counselling cards for our programming in Kyrgyzstan.





SPRING has also created IYCF and MIYCN images based on the UNICEF generic C-IYCF Package for training materials that support our nutrition-focused community video work in India, the Sahel (Niger and Burkina Faso), Guinea, and Senegal.





Most recently, we've adapted existing IYCF images and applied the photo-to-illustration process to create new high-quality materials for several other nutrition-related SBCC projects in India, Sierra Leone, Ghana and Nigeria.

In 2000, UNICEF developed and launched an integrated package of training, counseling, and take-home materials known as the Community Infant and Young Child Feeding Counselling Package C. using high quality graphic illustrations. 



The Photo-to-Illustration Guide gives program managers the resources they need to plan for and produce high-quality illustrations for use in their print and web materials. This guide explains the technical process artists use to create illustrations and gives guidance on how to find artists and collaborate with them to create visual materials that clearly and effectively communicate key messages.

The Photo-to-Illustration Guide is forthcoming (September 2017).

The Photo-to-Illustration Video Tutorial (below) demonstrates the steps of the technical process, from reference photography to line drawing, color, volume, patterns, and a final image for layout.
